## Kerrisdale Mountain Railway Tuesday 17th May 2022 Maribyrnong Probus

We depart your club rooms at 8:30am, traveling along the Hume Highway towards or destination, "Kerrisdale Mountain Railway & Museum" stopping for morning tea along the way.



Kerrisdale Mountain Railway is situated in the north-east foothills of the Tallarook Ranges. It is the steepest, adhesion worked, accredited railway in Australia, working in a zigzag formation to gain maximum height over short distances.

Climbing as it does, the views are spectacular and ever changing, culminating at "Summit Station", from where you can see to the far distant Alps, across the beautiful Upper Goulburn Valley and across King Parrot Creek Valley to Mount Disappointment. All the carriages are roofed with open sides to take in the spectacular views, carrying a maximum of 48 passengers. Kerrisdale prides them self on making your day an experience you will remember. (Please bring a jacket in cooler weather as the summit is quite elevated)

After our train ride we will make our way to "Bottom Points Steam Museum", featuring many vintage steam trains in a working setting, along with displays and demonstrations with commentary. The museum has a large under roof gallery area for viewing and is fun for all ages.

After turning back the clock of railway history, we make our way to the Railway Hotel, Seymour where we will enjoy a fabulous 2 Course Lunch, before heading home where we will arrive at approx 4:30pm.
